Teams will wear historically authentic uniforms and 1860's rules of the game will be followed. Gates open at 3PM. The first game starts at 4PM with the second game beginning at approximately 5:30PM.

Attendees are encouraged to bring lawn chairs or a blanket as there is no bleacher seating. Concessions and restrooms will be available. No coolers may be brought in. Proceeds benefit the preservation and maintenance of the Bacon Log Cabin on Henry Avenue.

Manchester Athletic Association is a private, non-profit organization serving residents of the community with sports leagues and programs.
